NORTHWEST VICTORIOUS AT CONVENTION



The 1981 Tennessee Junior Classical League Latin Tournament was held April 24-25 in Nashville, TN. TJCL president, Laura Lindsey, opened the convention at 8:45 Friday morning with a general assembly in the gym where reports by the six officers were presented and plans for the remainder of the weekend were announced.

The morning events—costumes, certamen, and olympics—began at 9:30. Harpeth Hall carried the olympic contest while Northwest was victorious in both upper and lower division certamen.

During the afternoon academic contests took place. Tests were taken in grammar, vocabulary, derivatives, and Roman life, history, and mythology. Optional tests included the overall five-test pentathlon competition and a reading comprehension examination.

Evening activities began at 6:30 with the skit competition and moved into the English and

Latin oratory contests at 7:00. These events were followed by a dance from 8:00-11:30.

The convention concluded Saturday morning at 8:45 with a second assembly. Here a slide program promoting the upcoming national convention at Miami University in Ohio was presented by Mr. Harper. Following the announcement of olympic and creative arts winners, the best oratory and costumes were presented to the group. New officers were elected and installed after Dobyns-Bennett presented its first place skit. After the results of the academic contests were published, sweepstakes trophies were awarded to the various schools. Clarksville Northwest took the overall sweepstakes award in the upper division.

The convention was run very smoothly thanks to the hard work of Mrs. Reinhardt and the other sponsors. All the participants enjoyed themselves and many look forward to going to the national convention this summer.

TENNESSEE VALLEY LATIN DAY



The program featured seminars conducted by Dr. Christopher Craig, Dr. Geraldine Gesell, and Dr. David Tandy of UT, and Dr. Jane Phillips of the University of Kentucky. The seminars covered many aspects of Greece and Rome including the life of Cicero, the Minotaur, general mythology, and the importance of Latin today.

The Latin Day also featured tours of the UT

campus and workshops for certamen preparation. With everyone dressed in togas, an authentic Roman banquet was held. Then the day was concluded with entertainment provided by Maryville High School and Junior High School, Doyle High School, Carter High School, and The Webb School of Knoxville. Other schools attending this Latin day included Jefferson County High School, McMinn County High School, Central High School, Halls High School, Powell High School, Bearden High School, and Farragut High School. Everyone participating felt that the First Annual Tennessee Valley Latin Day was a great success. Hopefully it will set a tradition to aid in the promotion of the Latin language and Roman life and its importance to us today.





LOCAL JUNIOR CLASSICAL LEAGUE CONVENTION


