NORTHEAST CONVENTION: "ONE OF THE BEST WE'VE EVER HAD"

This year the Tennessee Junior Classical League held its annual state convention at Northeast High School in Clarksville on the 23rd and 24th of April. Attending the convention were 860 students from forty schools: fourteen schools from East Tennessee, twenty from Middle Tennessee, and six from West Tennessee.

With Adam Kriger presiding, the first general assembly was held in the gymnasium on Friday morning. The assembly consisted of reports from various TJCL officers and an orientation to the day's activities.

During the busy morning, the delegates set off to the Certamen or Olympic events as participants or spectators. Track and swimming events were held at nearby Austin Peay University, while the chariot race was run at Northeast High.

Certamen and the costume contest were held simultaneously. Because there were so many lower division certamen teams, lower certamen was extended an extra hour after the academic tests were held.

In the afternoon the academic testing was held. After the tests, the majority of the delegates went back to their hotels to eat supper.

During the evening the skit contest and the dance took place along with the judging of English Oratory and Latin Interpretation. The dance gave everyone the chance to meet people and have some fun after a day of hard work. During this time, many of the candidates for next year's TJCL officers began their campaigns.

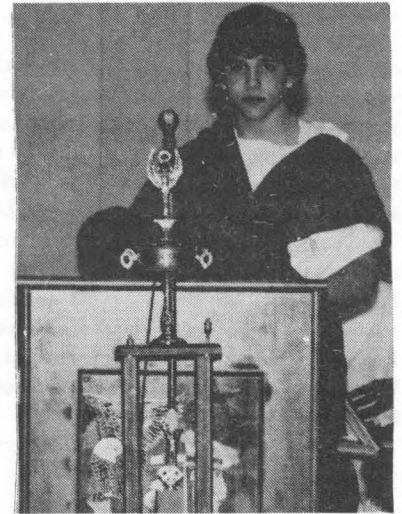
In the morning before the start of the second general assembly, the campaigns were in full swing. Candidates were giving out candy and paraphernalia. After the

opening of the assembly and several announcements, the TJCLers were shown slides from last year's national convention in Miami, Ohio, where Tennessee placed first in the nation.

The Olympic, Certamen, and Arts results were announced, and the best oratory and costumes were presented. Harpeth Hall won the overall Olympic events. Bearden High School won the upper division Certamen; and Northeast High School won the lower division Certamen. These two winning Certamen teams will represent Tennessee this summer at the national convention. When these results had been announced, candidates for next year's TJCL officers and their managers gave campaign speeches. There was a twenty minute caucus following the speeches during which time ballots were taken and votes counted.

After the caucus, the first-place skit, a comedy about Caesar and Mark Antony, was presented by Dobyms-Bennett. Then, the academic results and sweepstakes winners were announced. Brentwood Academy, Harpeth Hall, and Northeast received first-place sweepstakes trophies in their divisions. Following the installation of the newly-elected officers, the 1982 TJCL convention was adjourned by new president, Dawn Blair.

State chairperson, Mrs. Reinhardt, said of the convention, "The facilities at Northeast were some of the best I've seen, and the state convention this year has been one of the best that we've ever had." Mrs. Reinhardt hopes for significant TJCL attendance at this summer's national convention and at the 1983 state convention in Memphis.

Completed registration packets must be turned into Mrs. Reinhardt by June 1.

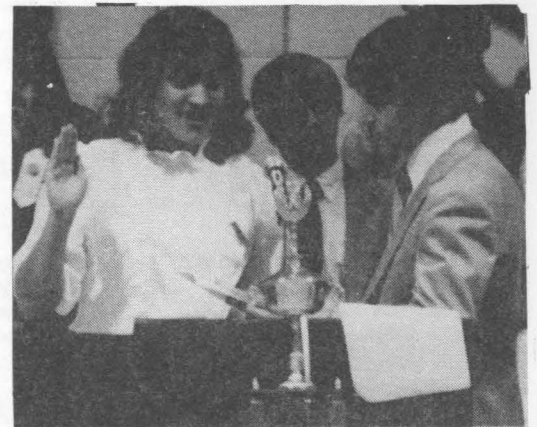

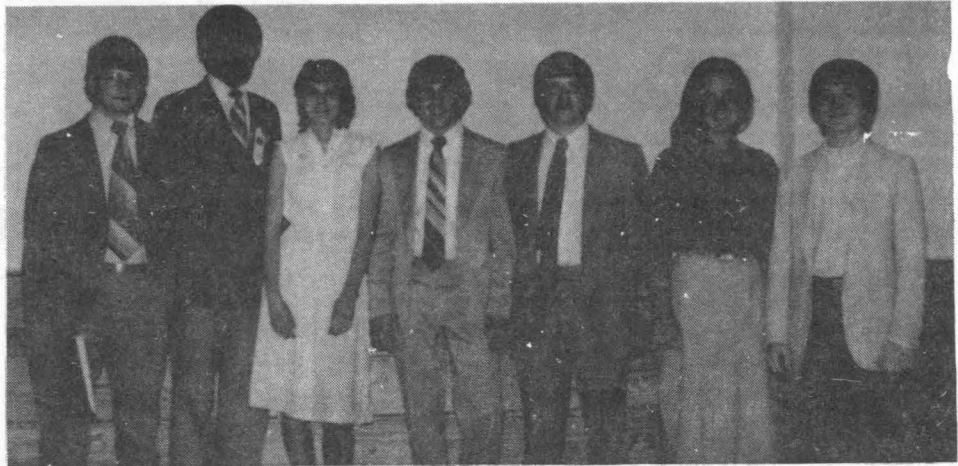

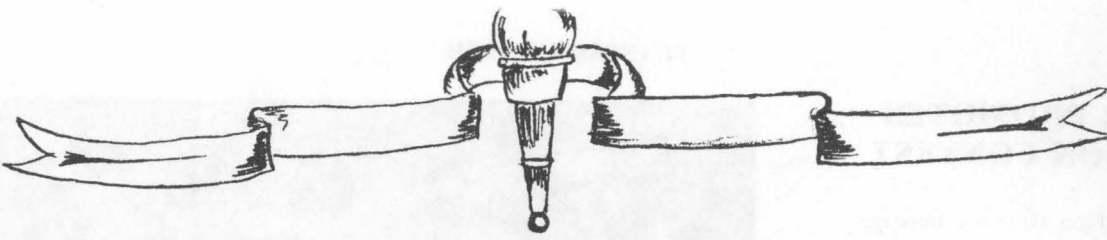
