

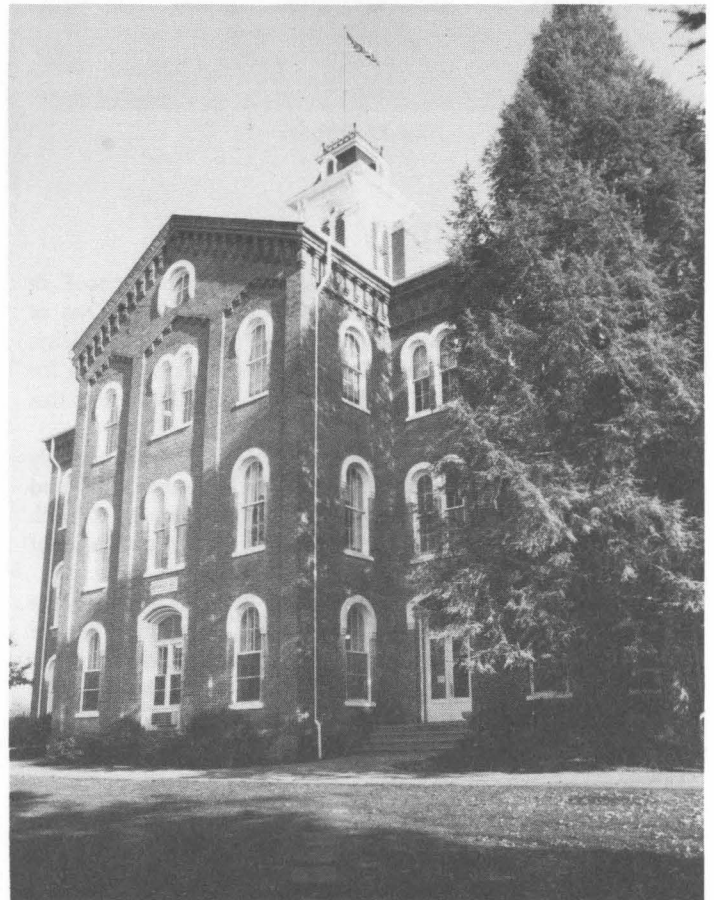
MARYVILLE COLLEGE TO HOST STATE CONVENTION

Maryville College, situated on 370 acres in the foothills of the Great Smokey Mountains in East Tennessee near Knoxville, will be the site of the 1987 state convention. The dates will be **May 1-2**.

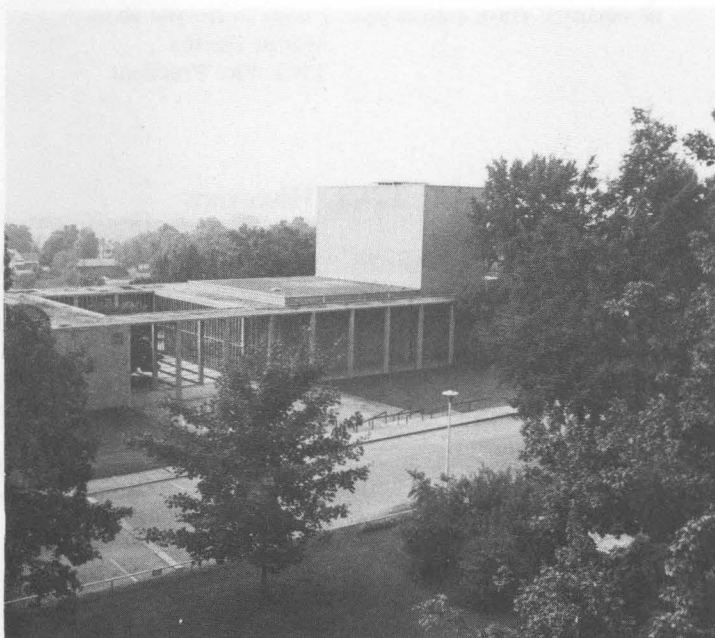
Four teachers from the Knoxville area will serve as hostesses for the convention. They are Janet Colbert (Webb School), Linda Hall (Farragut), Katherine Pettit (Carter and Doyle), and Charlotte Goss (Maryville High). A committee has met at the campus and plans have begun for a most exciting convention.

As Maryville College is a small campus, there will be a limit on the number that can attend. Any chapter with up to 25 members may bring everyone; however, chapters with 26 members and over will only be allowed to bring up to 75% of their members with a limit of 100 members. No chapter may bring more than 100 members. We are sorry for any inconvenience this may cause but this attendance policy will be strictly enforced with **no** exceptions.

Details, contest rules and regulations and convention packets will be sent out in February. The deadline for all materials pertaining to the convention will be **March 15**.

Ninety eight delegates from Tennessee attended the Fiftieth Anniversary of JCL at the 33rd annual National Junior Classical League Convention at Indiana University in Bloomington, August 3-8. Over 1500 delegates from 37 states converged on the Indiana campus for a week of hard work and fun.

Once again Tennessee won Academic Sweepstakes while Overall Sweepstakes went to Virginia. Among other honors earned by Tennessee this year are a third place Olympic Sweepstakes award, a fifteenth place finish in the publicity contest, third place award for the *Torch*, and last but not least, a third place finish in the spirit competition.

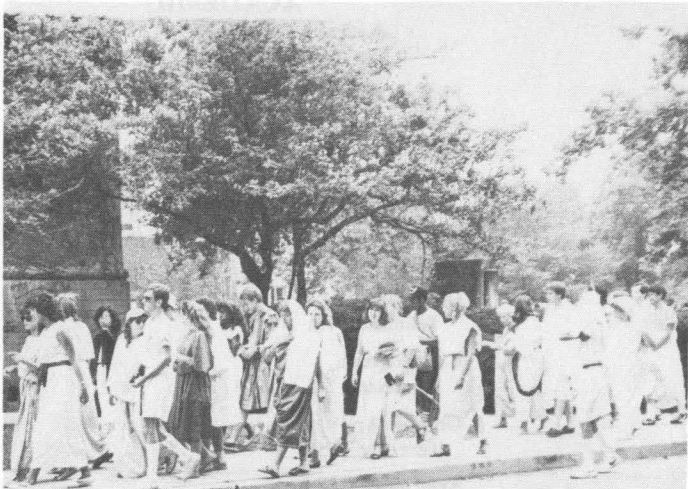

GUIDELINES FOR THE 1987 ACADEMIC CONTESTS —TJCL STATE CONVENTION—

1. Each test will have a maximum of 50 multiple choice questions.
2. There will be eight academic contests: Roman History, Roman Life, Mythology, Derivatives, Vocabulary, Grammar, Reading Comprehension, and Academic Pentathlon.
3. Sources:
 - A. Roman History-**History of Rome**, Cary and Scullard
 - B. Roman Life-**Roman Life**, Mary Johnson
 - C. Mythology-**Classical Mythology**, Morford; **Metamorphoses**, Ovid
 - D. Derivatives-No. 752 **Latin Word Building Etymology Based on Modern Latin, Book One** by J.D. Sadler. (List may be obtained from ACL, Miami University, Oxford, OH 45056.
 - E. Vocabulary-TJCL condensed list based on the ACL Word List by J.D. Sadler, No. 752. (New teachers will receive list from Mrs. Reinhardt; other teachers may request one list from Mrs. Reinhardt if needed).
 - F. Grammar-Allen and Greenough
4. The Derivatives test will consist of the following 4 parts:
 - A. The definition of the Latin ROOT.
 - B. Pick the English word **not** derived from the Latin word.
 - C. Pick the Latin word **not** derived from the Latin word.
 - D. English vocabulary; what does the English word mean.
5. The only contest in which the test is made out by the level of Latin taken is Reading Comprehension. Latin III and IV students will take the same test, one half of which will be prose and one half poetry.
6. There will be two Grammar tests, one for Latin I and another for Latin II, III, and IV. The same test will be given to all levels in the areas of Roman History, Roman Life, Mythology, Derivatives, Vocabulary and Academic Pentathlon.
