

## TJCL STATE CONVENTION RESULTS

### May 1-2, 1987

This year's TJCL convention was a smashing success. Approximately eight hundred TJCL'ers from all over the state gathered at the Maryville College campus in Maryville, near Knoxville, for a weekend full of Roman madness. Friday morning began with Registration and General Assembly where President Ryan Riggs officially started the convention and urged everyone to have a fun time. A Nominations Committee meeting, which was presided over by Parliamentarian Hal Rather, followed, and candidates for the 1987-88 TJCL offices were nominated. Afterwards, the Olympics and Certamen rounds were held.

Everyone adjourned for lunch and returned to campus to enjoy games of Ludi Volleyball, organized by the TJCL officers. Two and a half hours of Academic Contests were held afterwards, and the TJCL'ers left for supper.

After dinner, the TJCL'ers had a choice of exciting events to attend. The Skits competition was taking place where TJCL'ers could watch their peers perform in comedies with Roman themes. The Open Certamen rounds were also being held for those who wished to test their skills in an informal competition. And finally, where most of the TJCL'ers were found was at the dance. This year's dance was a huge success, with nearly everybody who went enjoying themselves.

The final assembly was held Saturday morning. At this gathering, the results of the contests were announced, the new officers were elected, and the winning skit in the Skits competition was presented. Meigs Magnet School presented their first place skit entitled **Chick-Pee-Wee Goes to Rome**. Lela Mahoney, the 1987-88 TJCL president, adjourned this year's TJCL convention. And with that final note, another TJCL convention ended successfully.





