

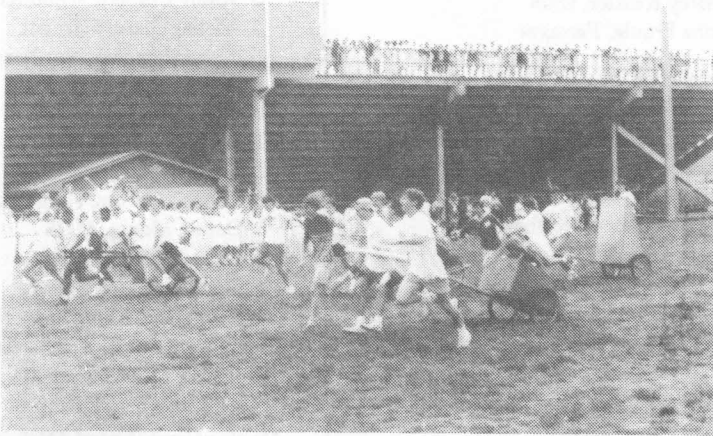

Farragut Hosts Successful Convention

Definitely Pleasing to Remember

In the cavernous and colorful halls of Knoxville's Farragut High School, over one thousand TJCL'ers learned that the 34th Annual Convention of the Tennessee Junior Classical League would indeed be pleasing to remember, as Vergil had stated in the source for the convention's theme: "Perhaps someday it will be pleasing to remember even these things." Each participant competed in a wide array of contests in the areas of academics, graphic arts, creative arts, and olympics, testing his or her skills against Latin students from all corners of Tennessee. Whether winning a ribbon or not, each came home after the two day event with an experience of competition, fun, and perhaps best of all, fellowship, that will be remembered for a long time.

The convention was called to order by President Lynn Sung on Friday, April 20, and following a general assembly featuring the Farragut principal, announcements of the day's events, and entertainment by the Webb School's *Esprit* performing group, the convention participants spent the rest of the morning taking academic tests. After lunch, they competed in Certamen, olympics, and the costume contest.

That night, Farragut was the site of the dance, movie, art viewing, open certamen, skits, and the dramatic Latin and English oratory competitions. After all the festivities were over, the TJCL'ers returned to their hotels exhausted and eager to receive their awards.

The next morning, those awards were presented at the General Assembly. With President Lynn Sung and Vice-President Pete Hoag presiding, the remaining state officers reported on their terms. Additionally, Parliamentarian Jonathan Weinberg introduced the candidates for the 1990-91 officers who were elected following their speeches. Winners were announced in olympics, arts, and academics, and the sweepstakes trophies were presented by State Chairperson Virginia Baird. With adjournment by the new president, Mark Hawkins, the participants went home with a new spirit of victory and friendship acquired at the convention, thus proving the real purpose of the Junior Classical League.

State Scrapbook

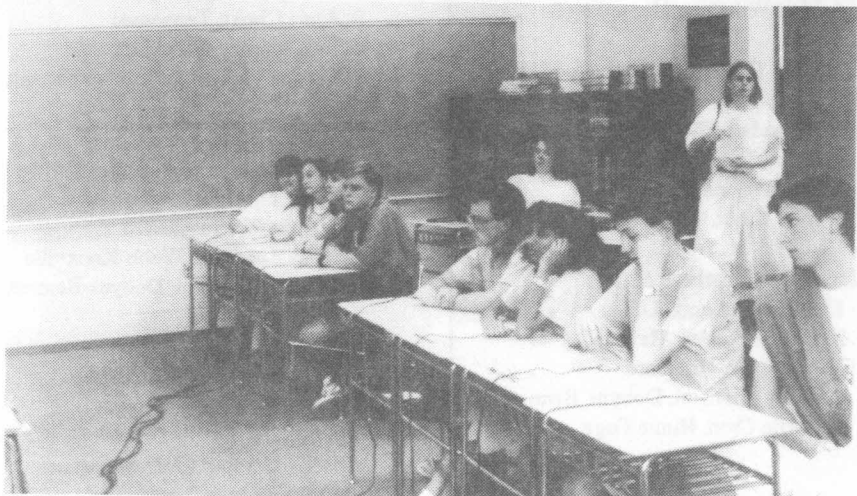

University School of Nashville

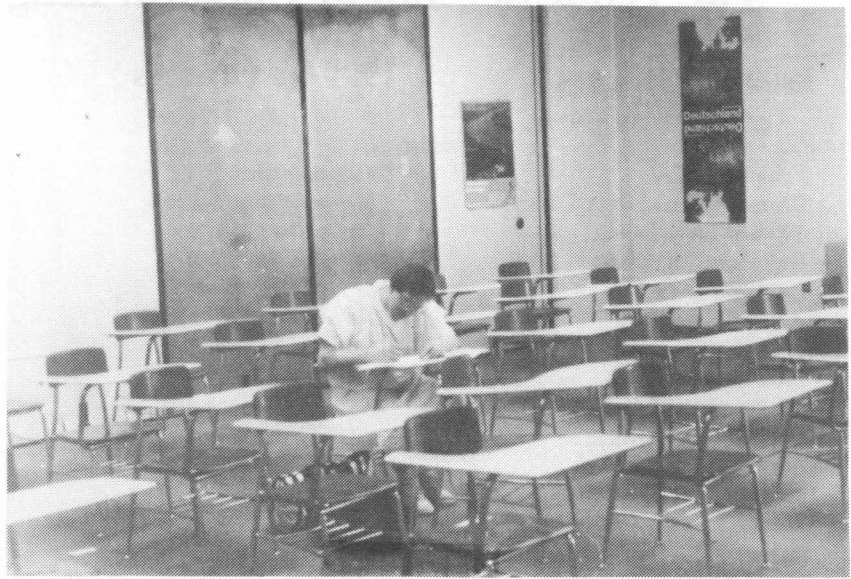

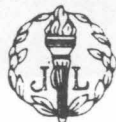
