BARBARA ANNE BOYLE HARDIN, one of Germantown's distinguished teachers, passed away on November 13, 2005 at her home. She was born January 15, 1952 in Great Bend, KS to Dale E. Boyle and Mary Anne Payne. Moving from Wichita, KS to Oklahoma City in 1964, Barbara grew up to the tune of Boomer Sooner. She graduated from the University of Oklahoma in 1974 with a B.A. in Foreign languages, Summa Cum Laude and Phi Beta Kappa. In 1985, she attained her masters in Educational Administration from the University of Memphis with a minor in Latin.

Barbara married Charles Tim Hardin in 1974 and they lived in Kansas City for 5 years and then moved to the Memphis area in 1979. Barbara Hardin was a shining example of the teaching profession. She was the Germantown High School Foreign Language Department Head from 1987 to 2003. She most recently won the 2004 Humanities Teacher of the Year for the State of Tennessee. Her other awards include TN Classical Association Teacher of the Year, Foreign Language Teacher of the Year from the University of Memphis in 2003, Distinguished teacher from the White House Commission on Presidential scholars in 1998 and 1990 and many more. '*Carpe Diem*' was her motto and she was very active in the Germantown Community. She is survived by her mother, Mary Anne Boyle of Cordova; her brother, Richard Boyle of Cordova; her sister and brother in law, Linda and Ronald Lang of Orlando, FL and nephew and niece, Christopher and Brenna Lang as well as many beloved friends.

In celebration of Mrs. Hardin's love of knowledge and her contributions to the TN Junior Classical League, a donation will be made in her memory to the Germantown High School Library. Anyone wishing to contribute as well may do so at the end of any General Assembly. The TJCL will match any additional donations.

DR. HARRY C. RUTLEDGE, age 74, the founder of the Tennessee Classical Association, passed away Saturday April 15, 2006 at Ft. Sanders Regional Medical Center after a brief illness. He was the son of the late Russell Weldon and Kathryn Carraci Rutledge. Dr. Rutledge was on the Classics faculty of the University of Georgia from 1960-1968, and came to the University of Tennessee as head of Classics in 1968, serving until 1991; he retired from the faculty in 1996. The former home of Dr. Rutledge and his parents, on Cherokee Blvd, was well-known for its receptions for visiting scholars, the Joseph Wood Krutch lecturers and the East Tennessee Society of the Archaeological Institute of America. Dr. Rutledge was past president of the Vergilian Society of America (1976-1977), the Classical Association of the Middle West and South (1979-1980), and the American Classical League (1990-1994). In 1992 he was Macebearer at the University of Tennessee. He is survived by his brother, Frank Rutledge of East Lansing, Michigan and sister, Phelia Lorenzen of Seattle, Washington, and their families. Burial will be private in the family plot in Hamden, Ohio.
